too of the Looney Tunes character Yosemite Sam carrying a Confederate flag when he was 16, she told the Post.

A reader sent the Post an email of pictures of Kovach wearing shorts while fishing that show a tattoo on his calf. But it's hard to see the actual tattoo in those photos.

The Confederate flag was flown by the South in the Civil War as they fought to maintain slavery in [See TATTOO, page 30]

**FED RAISES RATES:** The Federal Reserve said yesterday that it would raise interest rates for the first time in three years as policymakers look to cool red-hot inflation, a move that comes at a precarious time for the U.S. economy as it confronts a continuing pandemic and a war in Europe.

**HARRIS CONFUSED:** Vice President Kamala Harris suggested on Twitter that Ukraine is part of NATO, saying, "The United States stands firmly with the Ukrainian people in defense of the NATO alliance." The tweet has since been taken down and replaced with one worded differently. Ukraine is not part of NATO.

**MAN TAKES BEAR CUBS:** A Northern California man who admitted to taking two bear cubs from their den and notified officials after he was unable to care for them pleaded guilty to possession of a prohibited species, wildlife officials said. Cody Dylan Setzer, 29, and a co-worker who has not been identified and cooperated with authorities took the month-old bears from their den in a tree that had fallen across a forest road.

## Zelensky asks Congress for help

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky summoned memories of Pearl Harbor and the Sept. 11 terror attacks Wednesday in an impassioned live-video plea to Congress to send more help for Ukraine's fight against Russia. Lawmakers stood and cheered, and President Biden later announced the U.S. is sending more anti-aircraft, anti-armor weapons and drones.

Biden also declared that Russian President Vladimir Putin is a war criminal — his strongest condemnation yet [See UKRAINE, page 30]

# No money for homeless shelter

The state ran out of money to build homeless shelters in the Bay Area before Palo Alto's project could get a piece of the pie, but the city is making a pitch for the state to give \$27 million for the 88-unit shelter anyway.

vices & Housing Agency on Friday pushing for the state to prioritize the "exceptional" and "innovative" project at the former Los Altos Sewage Treatment Plant at the east end of San An-

tonio Road. The shelter, a partnership between the city and the nonprofit LifeMoves, would have two pre-fabricated stores, with 24 multi-bedroom units and 64 single units.

Burt said in his letter that the project builds off the success of a similar project by LifeMoves in Mountain View at 2566 Leghorn St., which Gov. Gavin [See SHELTER, page 30]
