Trump, Biden push for flippable states

LAS VEGAS — President Donald Trump and Democratic rival Joe Biden went on offense Sunday, with each campaigning in states

they are trying to flip during the Nov. 3 election that is just over two weeks away.

Trump began his day in Nevada, making a rare visit to church before a fundraiser and an evening rally in Carson City. Once considered a battleground, Nevada has not swung for a Republican

presidential contender since 2004.

The rally drew thousands of supporters who sat elbow to elbow, cheering Trump and booing Biden and the press. The vast majority wore no masks to guard against the

Micke Grove Golf Links gets new management

LODI — Micke Grove Golf Links has a new operator, Sierra Golf Management of Chowchilla, which assumed its new role on Oct. 1.

On Aug. 31, San Joaquin County approved a lease agreement with the company to operate the 18-hole golf course, clubhouse, driving range and maintenance facilities at 11401 N. Micke Grove Rd. in Micke Grove Park in Lodi. The course had been under a lease agreement with Arcis Golf of Dallas, until earlier this year, when the company notified the county's general services department, parks and recreation division, that it was terminating the long-standing lease agreement dated July 18, 1989, because of adverse impacts on business operations due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The agreement between Sierra Golf Management and the county is for 10 years from Oct. 1, 2020 to Nov. 2030, with two five-year options, at a base rate of \$72,000 per year plus

additional rents. During option period one, years 11-15, the base rent will increase to \$7,000 per month/\$84,000 annually. During option period two, years 16-20, the base rent will be \$8,000 per

month/\$96,000 per year. The lease also requires SGM to make additional annual rent payments to the county's Micke Grove Golf Course Capital Improvement Trust Fund in the amount of \$16,000,

plus 1.5% of its gross revenue during the original term and \$16,000 and 2% during any option period.

Sierra Golf Management operates 10 golf courses

CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

More rapid tests, but results go unreported

WASHINGTON — After struggling to ramp up coronavirus testing, the U.S. can now screen several million people daily, thanks to a growing supply of rapid tests. But the boom comes with a new challenge: keeping track of the results.

All U.S. testing sites are legally required to report their results, positive and negative, to public health agencies. But state health officials say many rapid tests are going unreported, which means some new COVID-19 infections may not be counted.

And the situation could get worse, experts say. The federal government is shipping more than 100 million of the newest rapid tests to states for use in public schools, assisted living centers and other new testing sites.

"Schools certainly don't have the capacity to report these tests," said Dr. Jeffrey Engel of the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists. "If it's done
